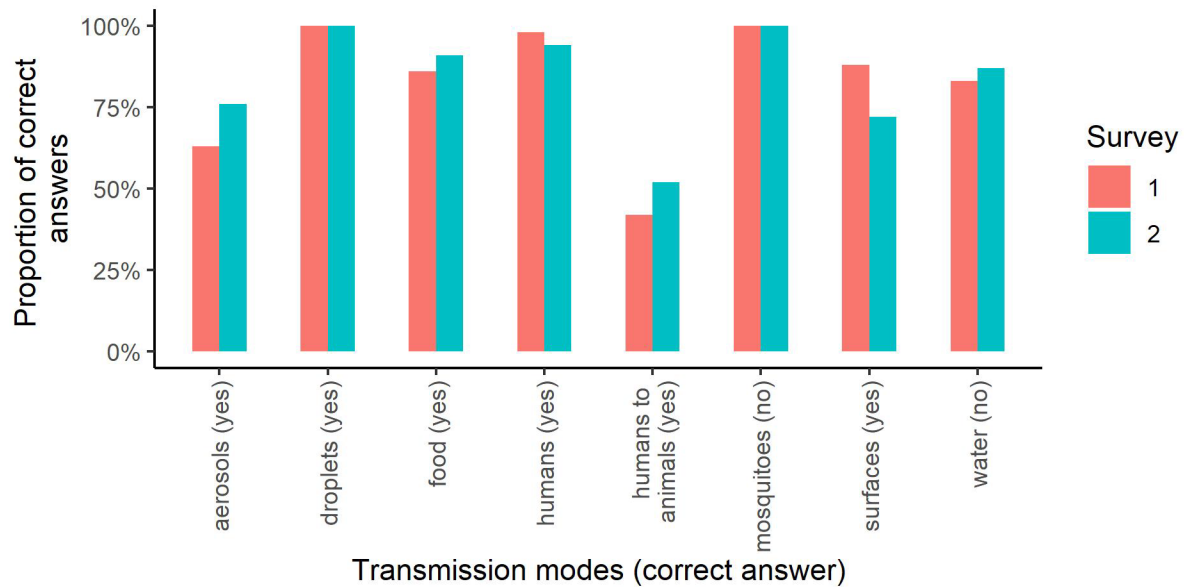

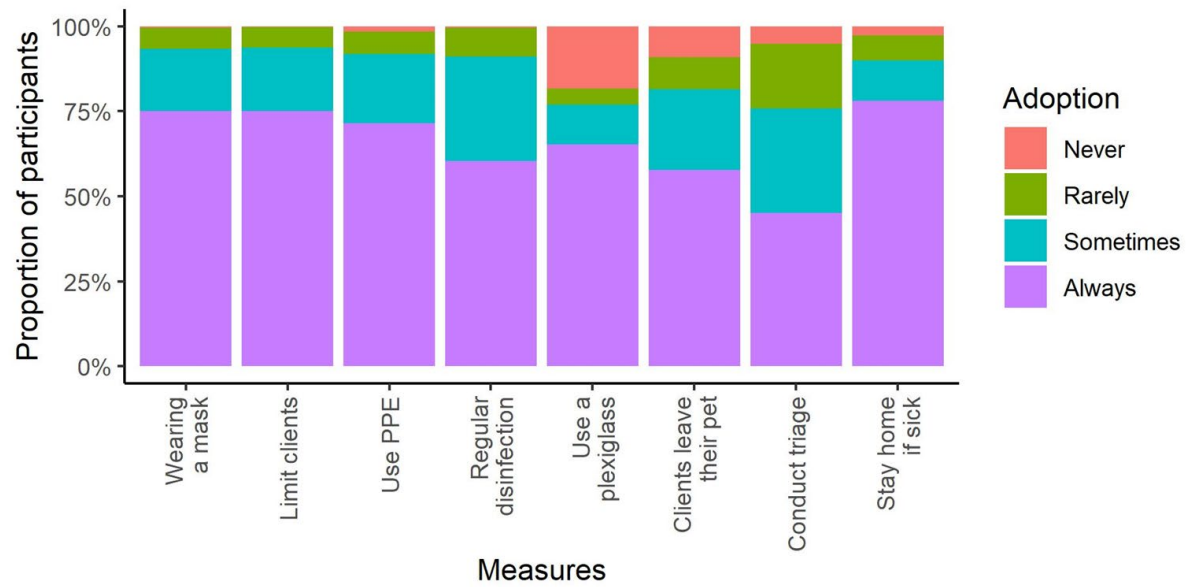

Frequency distribution of the difference ($T2 - T1^*$) in stress, quality of life (QoL), and professional QoL scores of 189 animal health workers. For QoL and compassion satisfaction score, a higher score represents a better state, hence a positive difference represents an improved state at T2.
